The attention deficit approach uses therapy in combination with medications, such as Straterra (chemical name is atomoxetine), Ritalin (methylphenidate), Risperdal (risperidone, an antipsychotic), Adderall (amphetamine) and Depakote or divalproex (a mood stabilizer).

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
