Conflict Resolution in Nursing

Good communication skills (see effective communication table) allow the nurse to resolve his or her own conflicts or facilitate conflict resolution between other individuals. As a facilitator, the nurse must protect each person's self respect by focusing on the issue (s), and not the personality of the party involved.

Instead, if managed correctly, conflict can encourage nurses and the people they encounter to discuss relevant issues and employ problem-solving skills.

Principles of Effective Communication in Nursing Practice

When a conflict arises, assess the problem and determine what outcome you're seeking. While the situation is occurring, try to actively listen to the discussion; avoid the impulse to respond until you know all the details. Being an active listener will help you avoid confrontation and choose the best strategy to resolve the conflict.

Conflict Resolution Conflict is a normal part of human interaction. In health care conflict of some sort has been estimated to occur in the management of a half to two thirds of patients. This conflict most commonly arises between clinicians, but also occurs between the clinician and the patient.

Collaboration is a broader concept including team functioning, respect, support for others, role clarification, leadership and conflict resolution (Mulvale et al, 2016). This is confirmed by the NMC code, in which communication and cooperation within the team feature as two separate, albeit closely linked, aspects of effective nursing practice (NMC, 2015).

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
